Sigma Sigma Sigma Builds New Sorority House at Kent State University
House Dedication and Ribbon Cutting Ceremony Hosted on October 9, 2010

Woodstock, VA - November 24, 2010 - Members of the Alpha Beta chapter of Sigma Sigma Sigma, a National Panhellenic Conference Sorority at Kent State University hosted a House Dedication and Ribbon Cutting Ceremony at their new sorority house, located at 1066 Fraternity Circle. In conjunction with Kent State University Homecoming, the Ribbon Cutting event was held in October, and the ribbon cutting ceremony was immediately followed by house tours and group photos. Barbara Stone, Beta Tau and past National Treasurer, attended the event on behalf of Sigma Sigma Sigma.

Jeff Skapin, resident of Stow, Ohio, is the architect that designed the house. Jim Stewart, also a Stow resident, is the builder. Winnie Warner and Abby Snowberger are the Tri Sigma alumnae advisors that spearheaded the project. The 9,578 square foot home will house 16 women and will accommodate over 100 women during social events. The home features a fire suppression system, walk-out basement, fireplace, handicap accessible restrooms, study rooms, walk-in pantry, extra large kitchen and meeting room space.

The Alpha Beta chapter was founded at Kent State University in 1925 and has rented several different properties for the past 20 years. The House Corporation purchased the vacant lot in 2004 from Theta Chi Fraternity and has been raising funds ever since.
